

SERVICE NOTES FOR THIS SUNDAY

On January 22, the nation will observe the 46th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision. The lives of so many people have been changed and ended because of that decision. But that is merely a manifestation of the sin that has been going on since very early in human history. What are Christians to do? We remind ourselves of what God's Word says and live our lives accordingly, praying that our life of love draws people to see the truth found in the life and death of Jesus.

The liturgical color¹ for this Sunday is red. As we contemplate God's gift of life, the color red reminds us of the blood that is shed when we do not properly care for God's gift in various ways.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

2. Read all of Psalm 139, which was the Psalm of the Day. Outline the thoughts of David into four main points. Which verse is the most comforting takeaway for you, especially in view of what you heard in worship?

3. What surprises you most in Genesis 4:1-16? I am shocked at verse 15, but maybe you find something else to be even more surprising. What makes it (whatever you choose) so shocking?

4. Write down three things you can pray about this week that touch on the sanctity of life.

5. If you were to focus on one of Paul's spiritually-minded suggestions from Romans 12:9-13, which one would make the biggest impact in your life? What about impacting the lives of those around you? What about impacting the people you pass by every day in the store or at work? Try to focus on putting one of Paul's suggestions into practice and see what happens.
