



TAKE HOME QUESTIONS

- 1. Think about the reactions of people throughout the Bible when God calls them to preach his Word, such as Moses in Exodus 3:1-4:17; Isaiah in Isaiah 6:1-8; Jonah in Jonah 1:1-3; Simon Peter in Luke 5:8-11; John in Revelation 1:17. What do these reactions tell you about the way people will normally react when they are called by the Lord? Summarize what God does to confront such reactions against service for his and his Word.
- 2. Find a short summary of the book of Jeremiah. Perhaps you could use the People's Bible Series or a study Bible or you could search online for an outline of the book. How do you see the words from Jeremiah 1:10 come to life throughout Jeremiah's ministry?
- 3. How do Jesus' words in Luke 4:43 line up with what he said in last week's Gospel from Luke 4:24-27?
- 4. The second reading from 2 Timothy is filled with so many wonderful encouragements and truths. Focusing in on 4:1-5 specifically, think about how you can apply these words to a situation in your life. For example: Is there someone you know who has "itching ears"? Have you used the Word with "great patience and careful instruction"? Have you "kept your head in all situations"?
