INVOCATION

Minister (M): In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation (C): Amen.

The pastor sings verse 1.

CONFESSION OF SINS

The invocation affirms that our worship begins in the name of and is directed toward the one, true, Triune God of the Bible.

- M: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness. *The congregation sings verse 2.*
- M: We confess:
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

The congregation sings verse 3.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

The congregation sings verse 4.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray.

Almighty God, look with favor on your humble servants and stretch out the right hand of your power to defend us against all our enemies; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

Please be seated.

FIRST LESSON

Men showed their unrepentance and the LORD dealt with them. After the reading, the announcement is made: M: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

SECOND LESSON

When we are tempted like the Israelites, God always gives us a way out. *After the reading, the announcement is made:*

VERSE OF THE DAY
