SERVICE NOTES FOR THIS SUNDAY

Final preparation to be the risen Christ's witnesses begins with sight. The apostles were blessed visibly seeing the risen Lord. Overcoming their doubts by the power of the Spirit, they would boldly proclaim the new life to be found in the Living One. Blessed to see through the eyes of faith, the vision of the First and the Last fills our hearts with confidence: "Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again."

The liturgical color¹ for the Easter season is white, which is the color of joy, perfection, and purity. It also points our eyes to the glory of heaven, where all of those things will be enjoyed by believers for all eternity.

- 2. Compare the demeanor of the disciples in John 20 to their demeanor in Acts 5. How would you describe the difference? How is such a shift possible?

3. In Revelation 1:17, John fainted due to fear at seeing the Son of Man in all his glory. The Living One comforted him by saying, "Do not be afraid." See if you can make a list of 10 people in the Bible who responded to God in fear; then see if you can make a list of 10 places where God says to such people, "Do not fear" or "Do not be afraid."

4. Many people have viewed John 20:31 as a great summary of not just the purpose of John's Gospel, but of the whole Bible. Do you agree with that idea? Why or why not?
