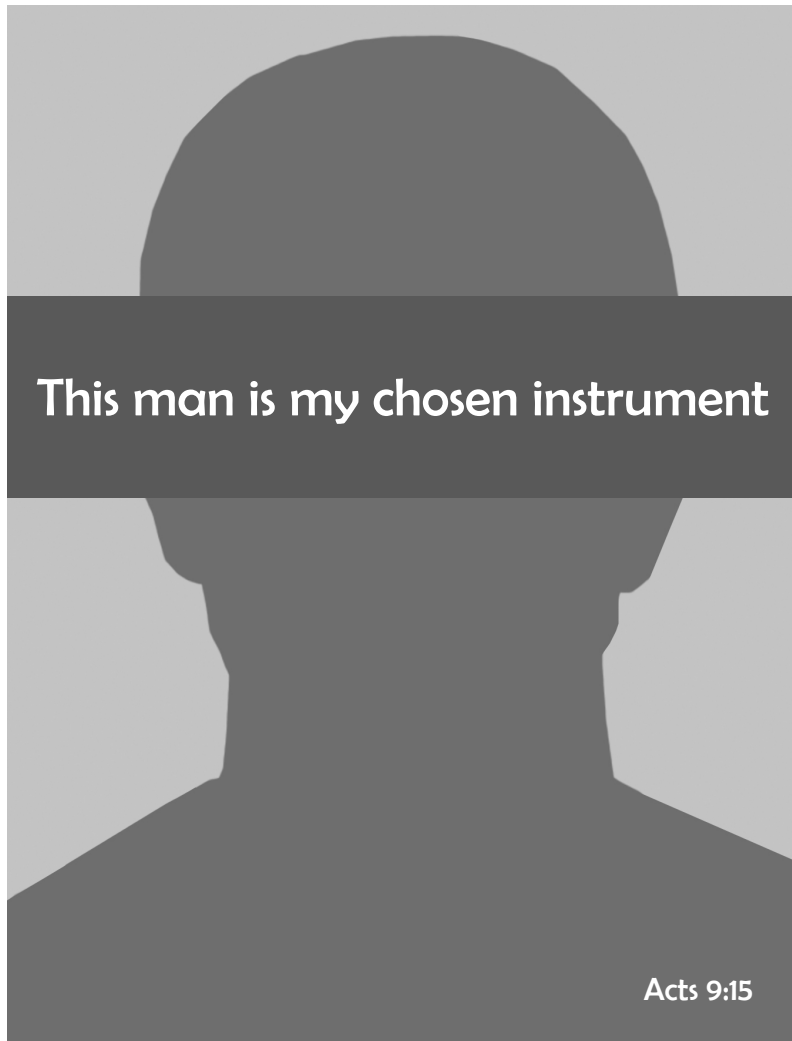

CONFESSION OF SINS

M: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

John 21:1-14

The risen Christ assures his disciples of his providence.

After the Gospel, the announcement is made:

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Christians composed the Nicene Creed in the fourth century to defend the Bible's teaching that both Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are true God, equal to the Father in one eternal, undivided trinity.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

TAKE HOME QUESTIONS

1. Read the Gospel from John 21 again. As you read, first, pay attention to details that only an eyewitness could know. Second, look for things that only the Spirit could disclose to a writer. Why is it always important to keep both of these aspects in mind?
2. In Revelation 5, the two hymns of praise that are said to the Lamb are interesting to examine. Look at the number of things that are ascribed to the Lamb in each hymn (wisdom, praise, honor, etc.). How many things ascribed in each hymn? Consult a People's Bible or a study Bible to see what those numbers mean in Revelation. With that information, what are the angels and creatures really saying?
3. In Acts 9:13-14 and 9:21, people voice their concern about getting too close to Saul; they were afraid this was a hoax! In what ways do you fall into similar thinking about other people (But, Lord, that person is a _____!)? When we say things like that, what are we really saying to God? What verses come to mind to push back those thoughts?
4. In Acts 9:15, God names Saul as his chosen instrument. In our minds, that might drum up ideas of success and power. But what is surprising about verse 16? What does that teach us about being God's chosen instruments?
