

OPENING HYMN

The invocation affirms that our worship begins in the name of and is directed toward the one, true, Triune God of the Bible.

Minister (M): The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ

and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

Congregation (C): And also with you.

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

The Rite of Confirmation



Confirmation is a public profession of the Christian Faith, following a period of instruction. It is a rite by which a person is recognized as one who is properly prepared to receive Holy Communion. Everyone is encouraged to join our teen confirmands in speaking these words of recommitment as appropriate.

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, our Lord Jesus said to his disciples, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age."

In obedience to the Lord's command, you have been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. You have been taught the precious truths of the Christian faith as confessed by the Evangelical Lutheran Church. You know what God has given you by his grace and what he expects of you as his dear child. You now have the privilege of receiving the Lord's body and blood in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

You are here to make a public confession of your Christian faith. The apostle Paul, writing to the Romans, said: "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Therefore, please stand as you lift up your hearts to the God of all grace and joyfully answer these questions.

- P: Do you this day, in the presence of God and of this congregation, acknowledge that in Baptism, God gave you forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation?
- C: I do.
- P: Do you reject the devil along with all his lies and empty promises?
- C: I do.
- P: Do you believe in God the Father?
- C: Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in God the Son?
- C: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell, the third day, he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- P: Do you believe all the books of the Bible to be the inspired Word of God?
- C: I do.
- P: Do you believe that the teaching of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, is faithful and true to the Word of God?
- C: I do.
- P: Do you intend to continue steadfast in this teaching and to endure all things, even death, rather than fall away from it?
- C: I do, and I ask God to help me.
- P: Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the teachings of God's Word, to be faithful in the use of the Word and sacrament, and in faith and action remain true to God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as long as you live?
- C: I do and I ask God to help me.

Be seated.

PRAYER

- M: Lord God, heavenly Father, we thank and praise you for your great goodness in bringing these sons and daughters of yours to the knowledge of your Son, Jesus Christ, and in giving them both hearts to believe and mouths to confess his saving name. Enable them to bring forth fruits of faith and to continue steadfast and victorious until the day comes when all who have fought the good fight of faith shall receive the crown of righteousness, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirt, one God, now and forever.
- C: Amen.

TAKE HOME QUESTIONS

- 1. Looking at each of the readings, which verse(s) from each reading would make good Confirmation verses? What makes them good verses for taking the next step into living an active Christian lifestyle?
- 2. In John 6:68, Peter asks a very good question that has an obvious answer to us as Christians—Lord, to whom shall we go? Answer: There is nowhere else to go to receive eternal life.—Yet, in our lives, what specific temptations and thoughts try to convince us otherwise?

3. Take another look at what I like to call Christian Life 101 in 1 Peter 3:8-17. We admit that none of us are perfect in achieving all of these perfectly. Which attitude or lifestyle is the most difficult for you to put into practice? Are there any that you feel are easier to come by than the others? Why do you think some are more difficult or more easily attainable than others?

4. Pray for each of the confirmands at least three times this week. Think of ways to encourage them in their faith in the coming weeks, months, and years.


