

Far above these earthly treasures and pleasures should be our desire to know, believe in, and serve the LORD, the one, true and only God. It is only when we are right with God that we have true and lasting peace, happiness, hope and love. It is only by means of Holy Baptism, the reading and hearing of the Word of God, and the receiving of the Holy Supper of Jesus' Body and Blood that children and adults are given true faith in the LORD God as our loving, forgiving and saving Father, Savior, and Comforter. A New Copy Machine

We recently took delivery on a new-to-us copy machine. The machine was mostly paid for from proceeds from the Willing Workers Bake & Craft Sale. Plus, each month the Senior Friendship Group takes a freewill offering, and they donated their accumulated funds to this purchase. Also the Hospitality Committee receives gifts from the families for whom they serve funeral meals, and the group donated some of their funds. We also received a couple of donations from individual members. Our last copy machine was purchased as a used model over six years ago. It had made over 3.5 million copies and was showing its age with poor copy quality and increasing maintenance issues. The upgrade will also save us \$1,500 per year on the maintenance contract, since it is a newer model. The newer copier is greatly appreciated by the staff and office volunteers. Thank you to everyone who helped us make this upgrade.


