### **God Knows Our Knees!**

"Yet I reserve seven thousand in Israel—all whose knees have not bowed down to Baal and all whose mouths have not kissed him."

1 Kings 19:18

"What's wrong with you?" "Grrrrrr...." "What is wrong with you?" "Grrrrrrrrrr.....awwwrrrrrrrr.....arrrrggghh!" Frustration at our house usually plays out in the conversation just illustrated. My wife plays the loving caring spouse...and I play the caveman. Actually, I play Elijah pretty well too.

The LORD spoke the words above to a frustrated, scared and disappointed Elijah. He had just had a great victory over the prophets of Baal (remember the fire from heaven, altar and offering consumed, prophets of Baal put to death). But, then came a threat from wicked Queen Jezebel. Like the wicked witch of the west she basically promised Elijah, "I'll get you and your little dog, too." But Elijah didn't have a dog...at least one that is mentioned in the Bible. Elijah fled for his life to a cave on Mount Horeb. This is where the LORD spoke to him.



Elijah pled his case, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, broken down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too." Hear the frustration? It has a deep and lasting impact on all it infects...even us.

We ask the same questions during the trials that the LORD sends our way. We too want to question God, "Lord, why is this happening to me?" – as though I am above such trials that the prophets and apostles faced. "Things shouldn't be happening this way!" – as though my temporary plans are on par with God's eternal plans. "I'm the only Christian around, and my life is the most difficult" – as though the gift of Christian faith makes me morally aloof from life's troubles.

Such is not the case, not for Elijah and not for me. God does have an answer for our frustrations. He knows our knees and the knees of those around us.

Where has the time gone? School supplies are hitting the shelves, clothes are going on sale, and fall sports are starting to ramp up practice time. Before we look to the future, let us take a short look back at last year. We were blessed with 57 students at St. Paul's for the 2013-2014 school year. It was a true blessing to have each one of those children in our classrooms. We made some transitions in the classrooms as Mrs. Engelbrecht moved down to Kindergarten, Ms. Smith moved into 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade, and I took over teaching responsibilities in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade. We added Smartboards to three classrooms as we increased our technology. It was a great year, and we thank the Lord for showering us with all these blessings.

As we look forward, there will be some new blessings. The first blessing we have received this summer is a Kindergarten enrollment of 12 students. Eight of those students came through our Little Lamb's Preschool program. There is still the possibility of two more students to enroll in Kindergarten. The Lord has also sent four new students and families to enroll at St. Paul's for the upcoming year. That means we have 16 new children in our school this year. This is a positive enrollment change of four students for next school year minus the graduates and students that have not re-enrolled. We thank the Lord for these new students.

As we go through the school year, the staff and school board will be looking at different aspects of school accreditation as we prepare for the accreditation process in the 2014-2015 school year. We thank all of you for the prayers and supporting comments that you have given us. These are needed and very much appreciated.

### Scrip Sales by Deb DeWilde

Going into the 2013-2014 fiscal year, there were some significant changes made to St. Paul's Scrip program. In the years before, the focus of the scrip program was helping families pay for school tuition. This focus remained in the new fiscal year, but the program added a second focus, the line of credit. The goal for the scrip program was to increase scrip sales to the point in which the return benefit to St. Paul's reached \$10,000. The goal of this increase was to generate more money to help pay off the line of credit loan.

The scrip program was blessed by our Lord by having an increase from \$3000-\$4,000 return benefit in the 2012-2013 fiscal year to \$13,831.66 return benefit in the 2013-2014 fiscal year. In essence, there was over a 300% increase in return benefits. The \$13,831.66 was divided in the following ways: \$7616.85 towards the line of credit, \$4782.02 towards family tuition, \$500.04 towards tuition assistance, and \$932.77 towards increasing on-hand stock for selling on Sunday mornings.

There were 92 families from St. Paul's that participated in the program. Sixty percent of the school families purchased scrip, and we have 12 families using the internet to purchase their scrip using Presto Pay. We thank our Lord for the blessings that He has poured into this program. We ask that he continue to bless the scrip program in the upcoming fiscal year. Finally, we encourage all members at St. Paul's to consider using scrip as we work together to pay down our line of credit loan.

### **Making Christian Education Available to All**

Northland Lutheran High School (NLHS) has two upcoming events which benefits their Tuition Assistance Fund. Northland's standing policy is that no one will be denied Christian education due to finances. The participants and sponsors of these events help provide the opportunity for young people to learn in a Christian family setting surrounded by God's representatives in a Christ-centered and integrated curriculum.

The first event is the Wildcat Open Golf Outing held at Indianhead Golf Course in Mosinee on Saturday, August 16. This is an 18-hole scramble. Participants can register as 4-person teams or as individuals. The fee includes a golf cart for the round, a meal, the opportunity to win prizes in a drawing, and hole prizes. This year's event will be fun for the family; in fact, students 18 and under can golf at a reduced rate.
