# First Words, Final Words, Words Worth Remembering

From the very first words that are simply spoken, to the very last words we struggle to speak, with every single syllable in between, our words share a message. They communicate what we believe. how we feel, and what we think is important. Very often those first words are so important that they are written with ink in a baby book. They are quoted and referred to throughout life. And then there are the final words; even if they are never written down. they are imprinted in the minds of those who hear them. Sometimes those words are and loud and confident, other times they are quiet and filled with doubt. Sometimes they have the cuteness of youth and other times they have the hardness of age. The amount of words do not make them important, because too often there may not be much time or much strength. These words are chosen carefully. No time for long repetitive statements, rather, carefully chosen words, making every syllable count.

Have you thought about the final words that will come from your mouth? What legacy, what message will be spoken and remembered. Will it include Christ? Will your words contain comfort and confidence, will they anticipate being with Jesus forever? Will they be words of encouragement for your family and friends to hold on to Christian faith until the day of death? Some day you will have to speak those words and when you do, will your final words be worth remembering?

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal.

## -1 Corinthians 13: 1

In the meantime, what words will you speak to those whose first words and final words have impressed upon you the importance of Christian faith? What final words would you share with such a person? Not long ago all seven of us siblings stood by the hospital bed of our Dad. One by one, we went up and shared our final words with him. We knew the end was near. As I stood waiting my turn, I was listening to my brothers and sister, but also contemplating my final words. What do you say to those who taught you to say Jesus? Which words does one speak in response to those who taught you the words of Jesus? What do you say to someone who will soon be with Jesus? How many words does it take to recount all the every day and eternal blessings gained? What final words does one speak? My final words were only few words, but they were heartfelt words "Thanks Dad, I love you."

Love and thankfulness for all his first words, final words, and all the words in between. Words worth remembering.

Ms. Smith will be installed as a teacher at St. Paul's on July 24, 2011, in the 10:30 service. We encourage all of you to attend this special day. Not only is this an important day for Ms. Smith, but it is also special for St. Paul's and especially the families in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade.

Another change this summer will be home visits. St. Paul's School Board has reinstated home visits by the teachers instead of school visits by the parents in early August. So, if you have a child in an odd numbered grade, expect your child's teacher to call in early August to schedule a visit. Home visits are half hour visits in which the child's teacher comes to the family home to discuss the

important aspects of the classroom. Home visits provide a comfortable location for parents to get to know their child's teacher better, learn the ins and outs of the classroom, and most importantly open a line of communication between home and school. We look forward to providing this valuable service.

On Wednesday, August 31<sup>st</sup>, we will be holding the opening service for the school year. The service will begin at 6:30 and will last approximately a half hour. The students will be dismissed from the service with a blessing from Pastor Douglas. They will then go to their classrooms with their teacher and their backpacks. The classrooms will remain open until 8:00 after the service.

The theme for this school year is, "Fruits of the Spirit: Planted in Christian Hearts." The theme is based on Galatians 5:22,23a, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." We will take a close look at this verse throughout the school year in our chapel devotions. Each month we will focus on one of the fruits and how it applies to our lives. We invite you to join the children on Wednesday mornings at 9:00 a.m. for chapel.

As a reminder, tuition assistance packets need to be turned in to the registrar by August 1<sup>st</sup>. That allows the registrar time to get the information ready for the August School Board meeting. Determination will be made at that meeting, and parents will be notified by the registrar of the assistance amount granted. These grants are made available through gifts given by the congregation to St. Paul's Student Assistance Fund.

## 1.) PRAY & ENCOURAGE -



Starting this fall St. Paul's will be home of a new evening children's group!
This new and innovative program for children ages 2-6 years old will provide the children with the powerful start in life they need, grounded in God's Word!
This evening program will contain three basic elements: music, large and fine motor skill movement, and Bible stories.

Music will be taught through the Musikgarten curriculum. This curriculum uses Bible stories and truths set to music. Children are easily excited through the use of rhythm instruments, movement, and singing.

Play stations will be set up around the room to facilitate large and fine motor skill movement and fun.

## Treasurer's Corner

While our fiscal year ended on June 30, the final financial results for the 2010-2011 fiscal year have not yet been finalized. Preliminary results show a balanced budget with income and expenses being around \$1,169,000. This represents a reduction in income and expenses compared to the 2009-2010 fiscal year.

To balance the budget we reduced expenses by \$27,500 by reducing our donations to synod, and we increased income by transferring \$20,500 from dedicated accounts (land sale proceeds) to ministry plan income. Further details about the 2010-2011 Ministry Plan Budget will be provided in the year-end report.

With the 2011-2012 fiscal year starting, we have started sending synod and Northland High School weekly donations. We also paid bills related to payroll, i.e. health insurance premiums, pension contributions and 403(b) contributions. Bills tied to missions, payroll, mortgage and utilities will be paid first with other obligations held to the end of the month for payment.

While we need to get our financial house in order to support and protect our ongoing ministries and allow for continued expansion of those ministries it's just as important that our members offer their time and talents to support those ministries. With that in mind we pray for wisdom and direction from our Heavenly Father, so that we might all be good stewards of everything that He places in our care.
