## Service Notes For This Sunday



When assessing the seriousness of need, one factor is how widespread that need is. A homeless individual needs food. During a famine, an entire nation needs food. It is substantially easier to meet the needs of the former than the latter! The more widespread a need, the greater the need.

When Jesus said, "*No one* can enter the kingdom of God," he declared that the need for salvation is universal. He rightly condemned humanity as a whole. There is no one on the face of the earth who can make the case that they deserve God's blessing. Yet, ages ago, God declared that all nations would be blessed. God has declared his love for the world and promised he would save the world. God's gift of salvation is meant for all people.

Some interpret this to mean that all people will be saved in the end. This is not true. The gift of salvation is meant for the world; however, it is received by faith. "Whoever believes in him..." the Gospel says. However, the good news is that faith is also God's gift, imparted through that gospel.

Today's service includes a celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. For personal preparation, consider using the Questions for Examination on page 9 of this service folder or Christian Questions on page 295 of the blue hymnal.

## Take Home Questions

---

1. In line with the theme *God Provides a Gift for the World*, John 3:17 says that God sent his Son to save the world through him. Clearly God's gift of salvation is meant for all people. Although God reconciles the world to himself in Christ, not everyone will be saved, as the teaching of universalism claims. What words and phrases in John 3 make clear how this gift comes to all nations? For what reasons does that bring us joy?
2. Romans 4 points us away from the law and our works as a source of righteousness. However, our sinful nature is wired to default back to these means. In what ways does this inclination toward the law show itself in our own lives and in the history of mankind?
3. Paul taught the Romans about faith by using Abraham as an example. Review the events of Abraham's life in Genesis 12-24. (See especially chapters 12, 15, 18, and 22.) In what ways did God's promises play an integral role in his life? In what ways does this teach us about the nature of faith?
4. In Romans 4:16 Paul points out that Abraham is the father of us all. In what ways can you see yourself in Abraham? Make a list of as many promises of God as you can think of. Then write a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to increase your faith in those promises.

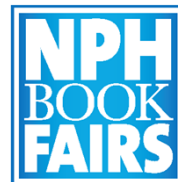

### **Jonah: The Grumpiest Missionary**

March 12 | 9:15-10:15 AM

If you were to ask a random person to tell you what Old Testament Bible story they know best, you'd probably get about 5 common answers, one of which would almost certainly be the story of the prophet Jonah. Some of the details of his story we know well; others, perhaps not as well. But, outside of the two times readings from Jonah appear on Sunday mornings throughout our three year reading cycle, have we taken time to consider not just the facts of Jonah's story, but what those facts mean for us today? For example, in which people (or groups of people) do we see ourselves? Is it important to know what kind of sea beast swallowed Jonah? What does Jonah say that points people to Jesus? What's with the ending of Jonah leaving us hanging with an unanswered question?

Starting on March 12, we will seek to answer those questions and many more as we begin a walk through the book of Jonah during our Sunday morning Bible class hour. You will get to see what it is like to dig into the original Hebrew text, while also mining the truths that God wishes to

communicate to you through the account of Jonah, who many call "The Grumpiest Missionary."
