



## TAKE HOME QUESTIONS

---

1. Look at the beautiful description of heaven in Revelation 7:15-17. Obviously, God couldn't drill down on the exact details of what each person will be most happy to be protected from. What three specific things will you be glad to be rid of in heaven? Try to be more specific than "sin, death, and the devil."
  
2. It seems to be a paradox that Jesus is both Lamb and Shepherd. What are some other things in God's Word that seem to be paradoxes? What brings us comfort when there are things in God's Word that don't seem to make sense?
  
3. We read selected verses of Acts 13 for the first reading. Read the whole story starting at verse 13 and going to verse 52 sometime this week. Answer these questions as/after you read:
  - a. For what reasons does Paul give a mini history lesson in verses 17-25?
  
  - b. Notice how often Paul quotes the Old Testament, also keeping in mind to whom and where he was speaking. What is he showing his audience (and us) by quoting the Old Testament?
  
  - c. Look at the variety of reactions Paul and Barnabas received throughout verses 42 to 52. What does that tell you about sharing God's Word? How does that show itself in the world today?
  
4. A few verses after the end of the Gospel reading, some people are ready to stone Jesus for blasphemy (verse 33). Looking at John 10:24, why is it so ridiculous that the people would react this way?
