Service Notes For This Sunday



God's words are so powerful! With only his words, Jesus cured illness and raised the dead. With his words, Jesus created the faith that receives his forgiveness. So we should not be surprised this week when we see that Jesus' words also have the power to push back the spiritual forces of evil that are in the world. Jesus' words expose idols as worthless and following idols as self-destructive evil. Jesus' words are so compelling, even demons must obey them. It is not surprising that God's words crush evil. It is a surprise, however, to see that Jesus' words have Jesus' power even when they are not coming from Jesus' mouth. Jesus puts his words on our lips. He makes us his witnesses. And as we carry out that awesome role, Jesus continues to drive back Satan and his allies, just as he did when he walked the earth.

Take Home Questions

1. The power of Jesus' word is obvious from Luke 8 as he drives out demons with a simple sentence. Yet that power doesn't stop there. Jesus gives us his Word and makes us witnesses. That theme can be found in all three readings for today. Reread Isaiah 43, 2 Timothy 1, and Luke 8 making special note of the witnesses God employs and the message they proclaim.
2. In 2 Timothy 1, Paul highlights the path of Timothy's sincere faith, beginning in his grandmother and mother. One of God's purposes for families is that children learn about the "grace given to us in Christ Jesus" (v.9). Parents, sit down and evaluate your family's priorities. Where does spiritual well-being fall? By a God-given "spirit of power and love and sound judgment" (v.7), in what ways can you prioritize your child(ren)'s faith over the next month? If you don't have a family or yours is grown, in what ways can you support and equip families in this endeavor?
3. Our society may not see directly the spiritual forces of evil at work around us, but they are real and working among us. Consider the effects of evil in the possessed man from Luke 8—isolation, humiliation, repulsiveness. These are everywhere in our world today. In what ways can we remind ourselves of the spiritual warfare being waged around us as well as the safety and protection we have in Jesus?
