## CONFESSION OF FAITH - Nicene Creed

## TAKE HOME QUESTIONS

---

1. In all three readings we hear the words of Genesis 2:24, which tell us they must be important when considering marriage. What are some reasons this verse is so fundamental to understanding God's perspective on marriage?
2. Ephesians 5 outlines the different roles God has established for men and women in marriage. However, what does God say about the status of men and women in Galatians 3:26-29? For what reasons is this worth focusing on?
3. Eve's God-given role in Genesis 2 was to be a helper for Adam. Ephesians 5 instructs wives to submit to husbands in this same role. Read Deuteronomy 33:29; Psalm 46:1; and Matthew 26:39. Who else was a helper and submitted to others? What are some things this adds to our understanding of this role?
4. Reread Ephesians 5:22-33. When Paul is speaking to wives, how often does he talk about the husband's role (not just the husband but his role)? And when Paul is speaking to husbands, how often does he talk about the wife's role (not just the wife but her role)? How would you describe the attitude Paul is encouraging with this omission? In what ways can we carry this same attitude into our relationships?
