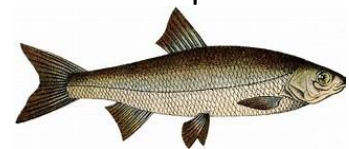
January 26-Feb. 2: Scholastic Book Fair. See the school note for times that the fair will be open.
